"Meditation"

A solemn observance, known as "Tenebrae," was first celebrated in the fourth Century A.D. The word "Tenebrae" means darkness or shadows in Latin. In this service, sections of candles will be gradually extinguished in response to the Solemn Reproaches of the Cross.

The Church remains darkened until the Great Vigil of Easter, and disciples must contend with the seeming victory of the darkness.
